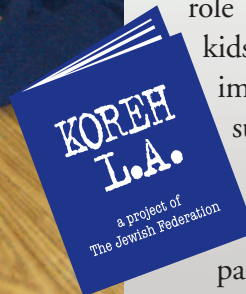


# Read All About It: Teens Succeed By Helping Kids Read!



Sometimes, all it takes for a teen to succeed is a chance to help somebody else. The Jewish Federation's volunteer literacy initiative, KOREH L.A., makes that success possible through its Teen Literacy Corps (TLC), which pairs classrooms of high school students with classrooms of elementary school children who need help with reading. The teens partner with the elementary children, and build one on one relationships with them to help improve their reading ability. A recent study of TLC's leadership and literary training by USC's Rossier School of Education concluded that by serving as role models to younger kids, teens not only improve their own literacy skills, but also substantially increase their sense of self worth and odds of going to college.



TLC has reached over 1,300 kids across 18 partner schools.
